## Original Eye Mask found at: [changes made in red]

Note: Do NOT hide your ends in the eye area. Hide them away from the eye area or your eyes will be uncomfortable using the eyemask.

Note: Eyemask works better in dark colors with dark contrast trim.

Note: If you have a hole in center of eye area that lets light in, there are three options: crochet tighter for the 7 initial sc, sew a piece of felt over the hole area, embrodier it closed using a tapestry needle. Try not to have a bunched area that will press on the eye when used.

#### Materials:

- Simply Soft Carron Yarn #4 type [Worsted]
  - Brown & contrast color [for base eyemask, trim, and band [if used]
  - yellow, white, dark brown, orange [for owl]
- G 4.50mm hook for initial chains
- F 3.75 mm hook for rest
- Tapestry [if felt used] [optional]
- Felt in matching or contrast color [optional]

### Sizes:

band size [if elastic is used cut elastic to inches of length below plus 1" for securing ends]

- XLarge = 22" circumference = 50 rows of 9 sc
- Large = 21" circumference = 44 rows of 9 sc
- Medium = 20" circumference = 38 rows of 9 sc
- Small = 19" circumference = 32 rows of 9 sc
- Child = 18" circumference = 26 rows of 9 sc

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#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

Step 1: Chain 39 stitches

Step 2: Use one as the original turning stitch then single crochet 10 lines of 38 stitches.

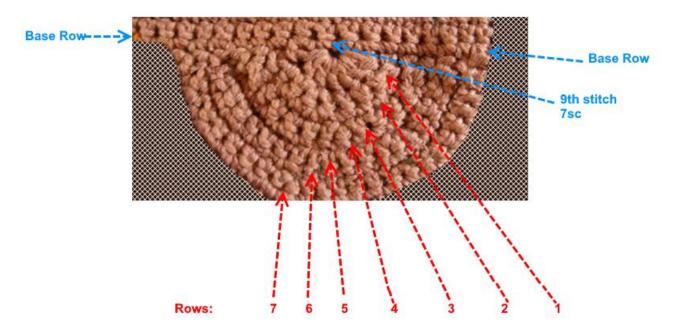
Step 3: Cast off the crochet.

Step 4: Start crocheting again in the 8th stitch from the edge with a slip stitch. from this position fan stitch 7 single crochets into the **9th stitch**, slip stitch into next stitch on base row, ch1, turn.

[Note: when doing the second side join in the  $10^{th}$  stitch from edge with a slip stitch and do the 7 single crochets into the  $9^{th}$  stitch.]

Step 5: Once this is done single crochet round the fan being careful to anchor each line into the main rectangle so it makes a joint up fabric. (It took me 7 lines of single crochet until the end of the semi circle met up with the end of the base rectangle.)





Row 1: sc in 1<sup>st</sup> sc, sc in next sc, 2 sc in next, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last sc. Slip stitch in next 2 sc on base row. Ch1, turn. [Note: use the stitch where you joined and next stitch for the 2 slip stitches.]

Row 2: 2sc in 1st sc, sc in next 7 sc, 2 sc in last sc, slip stitch in next sc on base row. Ch1, turn.

Row 3: Sc in  $1^{st}$  sc, sc in next 2 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 3 sc, sc in next sc, sc in last 3 sc. Slip stitch in next 2 sc on base row. Ch1, turn.

Row 4: 2 sc in 1<sup>st</sup> sc, sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in last sc. Slip stitch in next 2 sc on base row. Ch1, turn.

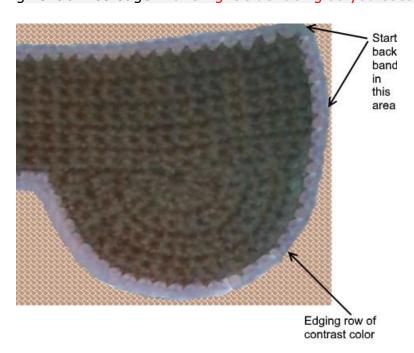
Row 5: Sc in 1<sup>st</sup> sc, sc in next 2sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 8 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in last 3 sc. Slip stitch in next 2 sc on base row. Ch1, turn.

Row 6: 2 sc in  $1^{st}$  sc, sc in next 8 sc, 2 sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in last sc. Slip stitch in next 2 sc on base row. Ch1, turn.

Row 7: sc in  $1^{st}$ , sc in next 5 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 7 sc, 2 sc in next sc, sc in next 6 sc. End Off.

Step 6: Repeat this on the other side. (It should leave a nose sized gap in the middle)

Step 7: Crochet round the entire mask in a contrasting color to hold everything together and give it a nice edge. Have right side facing as you stitch edging row.



# Option 1: using felt and no eyes

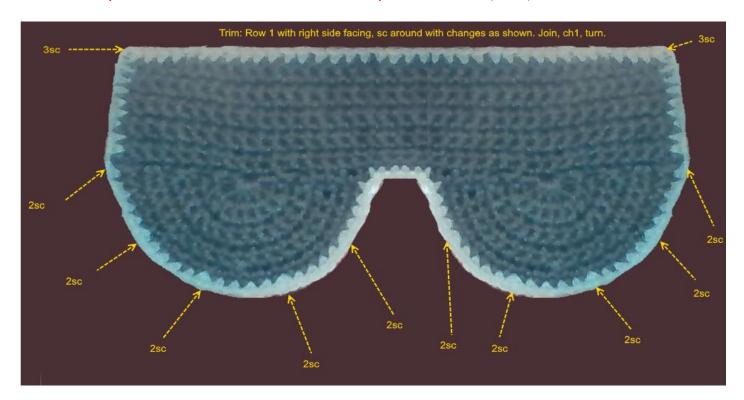
Note: Using felt, cut a matching shape piece. Sew to back of eye mask.

Attach elastic to side of mask at or near base row so the pull of securing the mask on your head

is not across the eyes.

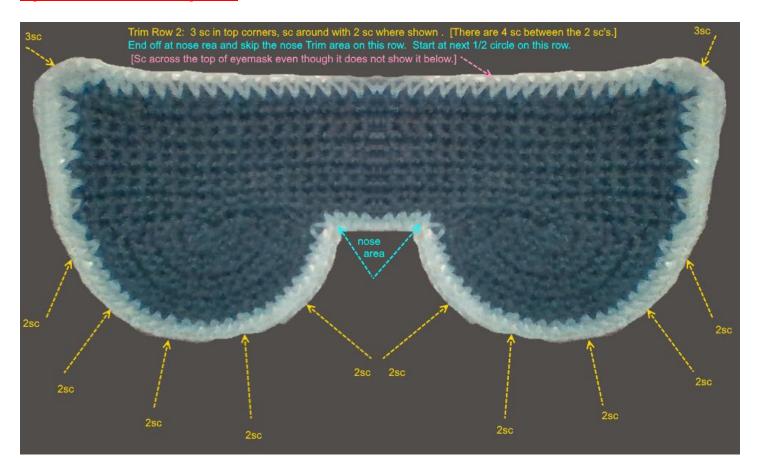


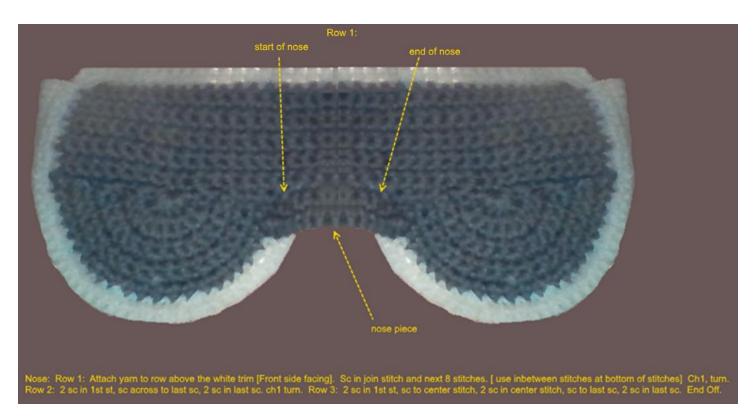
**Option2: Make two eyemasks** and with wrong side facing wrong side, using contrast color, and with front facing, sc around catching both pieces. Put 2sc in spaced areas of the ½ circle area so it lays flat. Put 3 sc in both corners at top of mask. Join, ch1, turn.



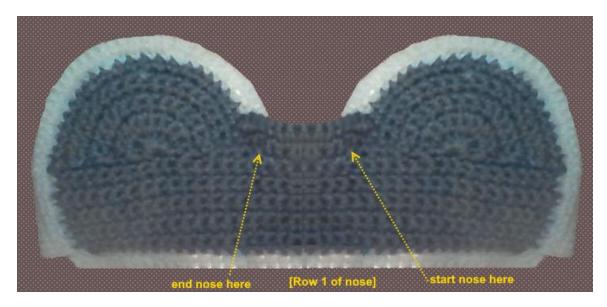
Do a <u>2<sup>nd</sup> row</u> of contrast color around with wrong side facing. However, end off at corner of mask and restart yarn at next corner of mask as shown below. This is so the nose fits snuggly in this area and light is minimized in this area.

## Option 3: With nose piece.

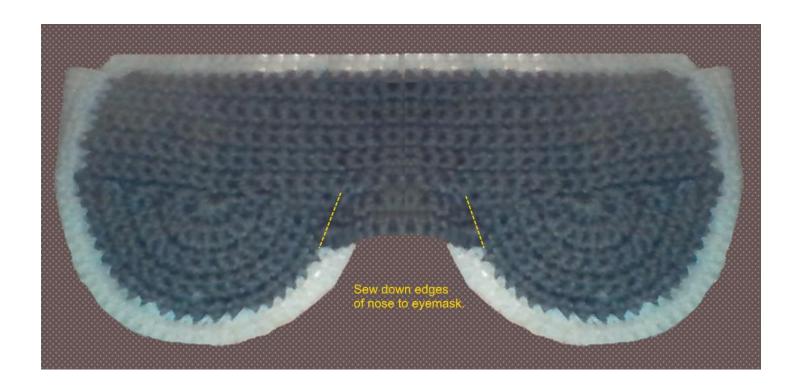




You might wish to do a row 4 [repeat of row 2] and row 5 & 6 [sc across -- no increases] It might look nicer if the nose is in the trim color.

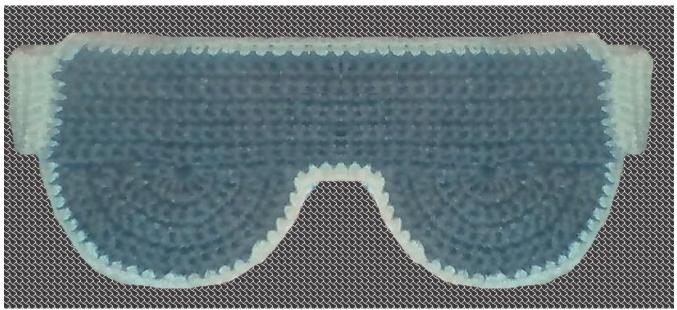


Sew the edge of both sides of the nose to the eyemask using a tapestry needle. Nose will not lay flat so there is room for nose.

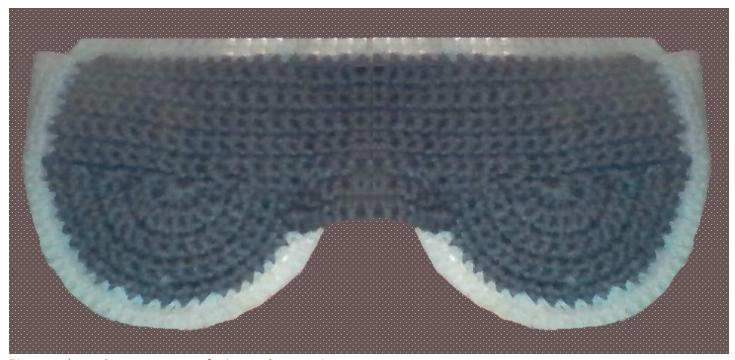


**<u>Tie/band:</u>** I did a band attached to both sides.

Join yarn at top at side with a slip stitch. Sc in same stitch and next 7 stitches. Ch1, turn. \*Sc in 1st sc, sc in next 7 sc, ch1, turn.\* repeat for length to other side around head. Using a F 3.75mm hook, do about 50 rows. If you desire looser, do more rows. End Off leaving a tail to sew it to other side. Using a tapestry needle and using tail, sew to other side. Hide all ends. Or.... Use elastic.
